INTERNATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE/STUDY ABROAD

UAB students enrolled in an approved study abroad program are treated in one of three ways: 1) Coursework completed by students participating in third party programs is posted as transfer credit. 2) Students participating in a reciprocal exchange are enrolled at UAB for tuition and enrollment verification purposes, and coursework earned at the exchange institution is posted as UAB credit with a course prefix of INxx. 3) UAB faculty-led courses are designated with SA following the course title.

NATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE

UAB students enrolled in the National Student Exchange for a given term will be enrolled at UAB for either NSEA 001 (if paying tuition and fees at an NSE member school) or NSEB 001 (if paying tuition and fees at UAB) for tuition and enrollment verification purposes. Actual course work earned at the exchange institution will be articulated to UAB course work and posted as UAB credit.

RESEARCH

Courses with a primary focus on research are designated with RES following the course title. Such courses are defined by active student participation in an applied experience under the guidance of a mentor culminating in the development of a substantial and presentable work product.

SERVICE LEARNING

Courses with a service learning component are designated with SL following the course title. Such courses integrate enhanced academic learning, purposeful civic learning and relevant and meaningful service with the community.

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
